The words "racecar", "kayak", and "radar" are defined as palindromes. They are the same whether they are read left to right or right to left.

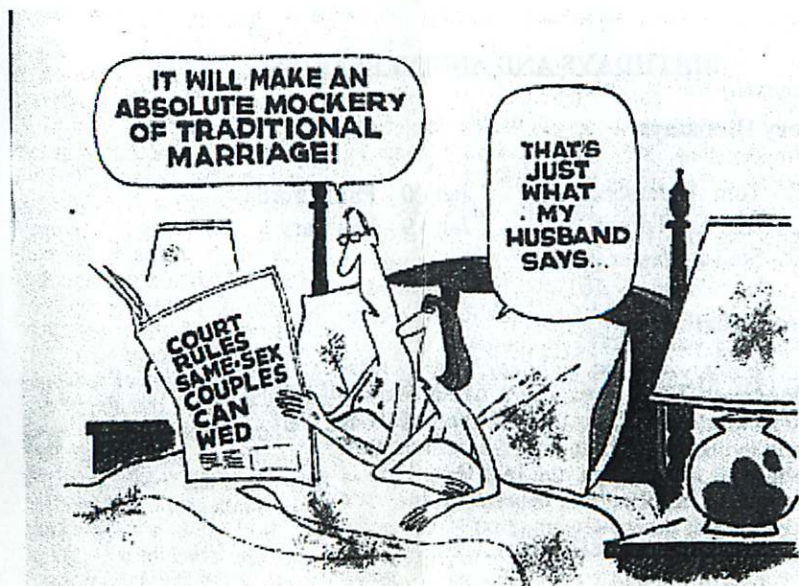
The sentence "The quick brown fox jumps over the lazy dog." uses every letter in the alphabet.

The only 15 letter word that can be spelled without repeating a letter is uncopyrightable. (Probably not a legitimate word, not in my dictionary)

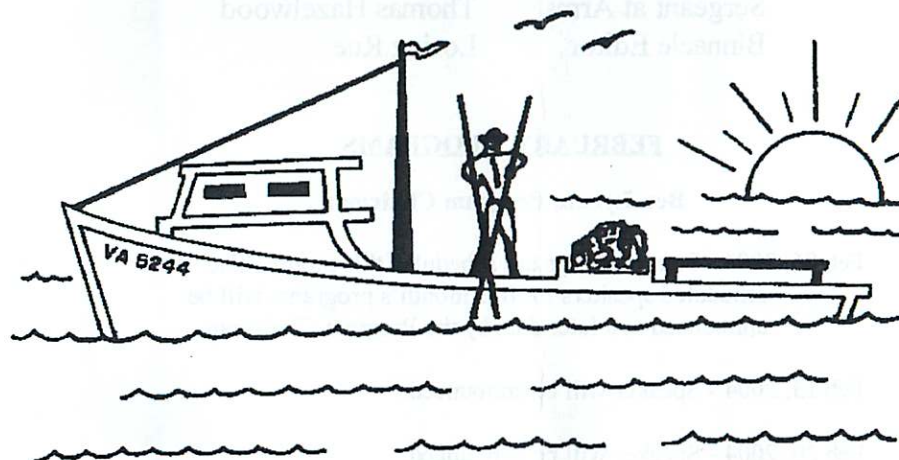
Vatican City is the smallest country in the world, with a population of 1000 and a size of 108.7 acres.
